Description

Typical height:
6-8 metres

Typical width:
5-6 metres

Growth rate:
Moderate to fast.

Typical form:
Spreading or erect tree with
pendulous branches.

Origin

Eastern Australia, mainly the western side of the Great Dividing Range, Riverina NSW and northward.

Characteristics

Small to moderate sized evergreen tree. Striking blue-grey, narrow foliage. Bark rough, fissured and dark grey. Bright yellow globose flowers.

Very ornamental small to moderate sized tree with good tolerances for Wyndham area.

Tolerances

High drought and waterlogging tolerance. Tolerant of frosts and clay soils.

Facts and Trivia

Known to attract caterpillars which develop cocoons in their branches bearing a resemblance to birds' nests.

Attractive, weeping form has global renown, being cultivated overseas including in the arid climates of Iran and Kuwait.
