Conditions of Entry

This Wyndham City Council facility is a shared space. To ensure the safety and enjoyment of all visitors and staff in this facility, the following Conditions of Entry apply;

- Treat all visitors and staff with courtesy and respect, and cooperate with staff requests. Verbal or physical abuse directed at other visitors or staff will not be tolerated.
- Take responsibility for your own belongings, and treat the facility spaces, equipment, and Library collection items with care, and ensure spaces are left tidy.
- Do not undertake illegal activities.
- Be mindful of others in regard to noise, including phone calls and online meetings.
- Photography, filming and livestreaming of others is not permitted.
- All drinks must have a lid, and hot food or any food that impacts on the comfort of others, or causes damage is not permitted in a Library space.
- You must look after and supervise those in your care. Children under the age of 12 years cannot be left unsupervised in a Library or community centre.
- Shopping trolleys, scooters, bikes, or similar items are not permitted inside the facility. These can be secured outside at the owners' risk.
- All risks, hazards and cleaning issues must be reported to Council staff.
- It is not permitted to smoke, vape, consume or be under the influence of alcohol or any illegal substances in the facility.

Wyndham City Council staff have the right to ask any person to leave the facility if they do not comply with these Conditions of Entry. Failure to abide by the conditions of entry can lead to removal from premises and potential future exclusion of entry.
