How can learners of UNESCO Learning Cities access the courses?

Step 1:

As a UNESCO Learning City resident, you have FREE ACCESS to [the UNESCO GNLC sustainability collection](#) on the FutureLearn website. Simply register on FutureLearn and use the code **GNLC_WyndhamAustraliaCourse1** to join a course from the sustainability collection.

Step 2:

The code includes a consecutive number (from 1-12). If you wish to enroll in several courses, you can easily do so by changing the last digit of the code for each enrolment. For example, if you enroll in a second course the code would be **GNLC_WyndhamAustraliaCourse2**, a third course would be **GNLC_WyndhamAustraliaCourse3**, and so forth up to a maximum of 12 courses.
